PARKING GARAGE: MAGNOLIA – ACROSS THE STREET FROM THE RAMADA LIMITED JERSEY CITY (Tonnele Avenue and Magnolia Street)

Via NJ Turnpike Southbound:

Exit 15W (Newark/The Oranges). After the tollbooth, follow Interstate 280 East to Jersey City (Holland tunnel). At the circle, make a right onto Tonnele Avenue. Pass 3 lights and you will see the **Magnolia Parking Garage** on your **left hand side**. The Conference Center is 1 block.

Via Garden State Parkway Southbound:

Follow to Exit 145- Interstate 280. Continue on Interstate 280 East toward Jersey City. At the circle, make a right onto Tonnele Avenue. Pass 3 lights and you will see the **Magnolia Parking Garage** on your **left hand side**. The Conference Center is 1 block.

Via NJ Turnpike Northbound:

Follow to Exit 14 Newark Airport. After the tollbooth, follow signs to Route 1-9 North to the Pulaski Skyway (Holland tunnel). Exit at Tonnele Avenue, at the light make a right turn into Tonnele Avenue. Pass 3 lights and you will see the **Magnolia Parking Garage** on your **left hand side**. The Conference Center is 1 block.

Via Garden State Parkway Northbound:

Follow to Exit 140 (Rt. 22 East). Route 22 East to Routes 1 & 9 North to Pulaski Skyway (Holland tunnel). Exit at Tonnele Avenue, at the light make a right turn into Tonnele Avenue. Pass 3 lights and you will see the **Magnolia Parking Garage** on your **left hand side**. The Conference Center is 1 block.

Via Lincoln Tunnel:

Interstate 495 toward the NJ Turnpike South to Exit 15W (Newark/The Oranges). After the tollbooth, follow Interstate 280 East to Jersey City (Holland tunnel). At the circle, make a right onto Tonnele Avenue. Pass 3 lights and you will see the **Magnolia Parking Garage** on your **left hand side**. The Conference Center is 1 block.

Via Holland Tunnel:

Cross Holland Tunnel, stay on your left-hand side to Routes 1-9 / Pulaski Skyway. Take the first exit, continue to the circle. Follow the circle as if you are going back to the tunnel. At the light, make a right turn into Tonnele Avenue. Pass 3 lights and you will see the **Magnolia Parking Garage** on your **left hand side**. The Conference Center is 1 block.

Via Interstate 78:

Follow toward Newark Airport, use the exit for Routes 1 & 9. Route 1-9 North to the Pulaski Skyway (Holland tunnel). Exit at Tonnele Avenue, at the light make a right turn into Tonnele Avenue. Pass 3 lights and you will see the **Magnolia Parking Garage** on your **left hand side**. The Conference Center is 1 block.

From I-295 North:

Proceed on 295 North to Exit 40A (Route 38 East).
Proceed on 38 East & follow signs for Hartford Road North.
Stay in right lane.
You will have to take a jug handle around the gas station.
After jug handle you will be at the light facing Route 38. Make a left on to Route 38 West.
We are on the Campus of Burlington County College. Turn right into the College Campus.
Turn Left into the first parking lot.
Access to The Enterprise Center is through the Votta Pavilion.

From I-295 South:

Follow 295 South to Exit 40 (Route 38 West).
As soon as you come off the exit, stay in right lane & take the jug handle (MarterAve/38 East).
When you come around the jug handle you will be facing Route 38.
Make a Left on to Route 38 East.
Proceed on 38 East & follow signs for Hartford Road North.
Stay in right lane.
You will have to take another jug handle around the gas station.
After jug handle you will be at the light facing Route 38. Make a left on to Route 38 West.
Stay in the right lane.
We are on the Campus of Burlington County College. Turn right into the Campus.
Turn left into the first parking lot.
Access to The Enterprise Center is through the Votta Pavilion.

From South Jersey:

Take the Garden State Parkway North (portions Toll) to the Atlantic City Expressway West (Exit 38A). A.C. Expressway turns into Route 42 North. 42 North turns into 76 West. Take 76 West to Exit 1B (295 North). See “**From I-295 North**” directions above.

From the New Jersey Turnpike:

Follow the New Jersey Turnpike to Exit 4. Take 73 North to 295 North. See “From I-295 North” directions above.
