ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 3(d) OF BOND
ORDINANCE NUMBERED 5-2013 OF THE
TOWNSHIP OF MOUNT OLIVE, IN THE COUNTY
OF MORRIS, NEW JERSEY, FINALLY ADOPTED
MARCH 19, 2013 IN ORDER TO AMEND THE
DESCRIPTION OF THE PROJECT.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF
MOUNT OLIVE, IN THE COUNTY OF MORRIS, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-
thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Section One. Section 3(d) of Bond Ordinance numbered 5-2013 of the Township of
Mount Olive, in the County of Morris, New Jersey (the "Township"), finally adopted March 19,
2013, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(d) Health Department

The acquisition of utility vehicles,
including all related costs and
expenditures incidental thereto.

Section Two. The Township hereby certifies that it has adopted a capital budget or a
temporary capital budget, as applicable. The capital or temporary capital budget of the Township
is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any
inconsistency herewith. To the extent that the purposes authorized herein are inconsistent with
the adopted capital or temporary capital budget, a revised capital or temporary capital budget has
been filed with the Division of Local Government Services.

Section Three. This ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof
after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.
