

**Important Information From the NJDEP  
Regarding Waterway Debris Removal Project**

The NJDEP will be identifying and removing FEMA-eligible storm debris from NJ waterways during the period of May 9 through June 11, 2013. Please see following letter from Cindy Randazzo, Director, Office of Local Government Assistance, NJDEP regarding the Superstorm Sandy Waterway Debris Removal Project.

Dear Mayor and Municipal Representative,

With beach season around the corner, the Department of Environmental Protection's Superstorm Sandy Waterway Debris Removal project is working to identify and remove FEMA-eligible storm debris in the ocean and on the beaches (up to the mean high tide line). Side-scan sonar work in the ocean is expected to take place during the period May 8-

June 10, and removal of storm debris in the ocean is expected to take place during the period May 9 - June 11. (Schedules are weather-dependent.)

The Department wants to ensure that we coordinate with our municipalities in responding to Superstorm Sandy waterway debris that may wash up on our beaches throughout the Summer. The attached Protocol for Removal of Storm Debris from Beaches explains the respective roles of the Department and municipalities in removing storm debris from beaches, and provides a simple mechanism for municipalities to request assistance in removal of storm debris from beaches.



