**Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED)** is an approach to deterring criminal behavior through environmental design. Its strategies rely upon enhancing the built environment to create a setting that is comfortable for desirable uses, and less susceptible to the commission of crime. It focuses on surveillance, access control, territoriality, maintenance, and activity support, and derives very specific strategies that address lighting, visibility, elimination of hazards, and proactive ways to assert control of public spaces. CPTED can be applied in downtown retail corridors to enhance shopper comfort and safety, and to train merchants in safer retail practices for the operation of their stores.




