The New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) is pleased to invite you to an upcoming Complete Streets Implementation Training Workshop. We encourage you to participate in this session aimed to educate municipalities and counties with adopted Complete Streets policies about implementing Complete Streets in their communities.
