

About our Presenter:

Andrea Proctor was hired by the New Jersey Division of Parks and Forestry in 2013 to serve as the Resource Interpretive Specialist for Waterloo Village, a State owned Historic Site. Andrea is responsible for developing and overseeing the educational programming at the site including school and scout programs, walking tours, and outreach programs. She is currently facilitating collaborative planning sessions, coordinating site-specific interpretive outlines with partnership organizations, and developing innovative strategies to attract visitors. Andrea has highlighted both the Musconetcong River and Morris Canal Greenway by incorporating each as a fundamental resource and component in the interpretive focus for Waterloo Village.
