2014-2015 Legislative Session

## THE FOLLOWING BILLS WERE ENACTED AS THE PUBLIC LAWS OF 2014/2015:

Chapter 3                      A-1483                      1/16/2015

Eliminates DOT approval of municipal traffic calming measures in business districts.

Chapter 5                      S-1050                      2/5/2015

Extends for five years expiration date of special appraisal process for Green Acres program and farmland preservation program for lands in Highlands Region; makes change to special appraisal process for certain farmers.

Chapter 10                      S-2378                      2/5/2015

Extends "Overdose Prevention Act" immunity provisions to certain professionals and professional entities, and permits needle exchange programs to obtain standing order for opioid antidote.

Chapter 16                      A-3357                      2/5/2015

Authorizes tax lien holders other than municipalities to institute in rem tax foreclosure actions against abandoned properties.

Chapter 18                      A-3628                      2/5/2015

"Water Infrastructure Protection Act."

Chapter 19                      A-3969                      2/5/2015

"Hackensack Meadowlands Agency Consolidation Act"; "Hackensack Meadowlands Transportation Planning District Act of 2014"; "New Jersey Meadowlands Tax Relief Act."

Chapter 20                      A-2305                      2/6/2015

Requires DEP Commissioner to periodically study and make recommendations concerning blue roofs and green roofs.

Chapter 21                      A-2479                      2/6/2015

Requires elevators in new buildings be at least a certain size.

Chapter 63                      A-3213                      10/24/2014

"Economic Opportunity Act of 2014, Part 3."

Chapter 64                      S-1092                      11/13/2014

Reduces amount of fire duty required in order to receive exempt fireman certificate.


Chapter 83                      A-3629                      12/26/2014

Eliminates voter registration and in-district residency requirements for certain petition circulators; eliminates in-district residency requirement for petition circulators for partisan primary nominations; establishes petition circulator criteria.

Chapter 89                      S-2021                      1/9/2015

Exempts certain temporary farm structures from permit and transition area requirements of "Freshwater Wetlands Protection Act."
