The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has released the Request for Proposals (RFP) for the 2015 Pollution Prevention (P2) grant competition. EPA's national P2 program has introduced three, new areas of emphasis: 1) Climate Change; 2) Food Manufacturing; and 3) Reducing Hazardous Materials in Communities. There will be a webinar on these new areas of emphasis from **1:00 to 2:00 pm EST on Wednesday, March 25**. The national area of emphasis, "Reducing Hazardous Materials in Communities," is also a regional priority. In the wake of Hurricane Sandy, EPA Region 2 is interested in promoting projects that reduce toxics in communities that are susceptible to flooding, and bear a disproportionate share of the negative environmental consequences resulting from industrial and commercial operations.

Projects need to demonstrate that they will collect measurable results in one or more of the following metrics: greenhouse gases reduced; water conserved; hazardous materials reduced; and dollars saved. The P2 grant competition is open to state entities (e.g., state agencies, state universities, etc.) and tribes. Applicants must provide a match of 50% or more of the total project cost. Proposals may only be submitted electronically through Grants.gov. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact me.
