

Don't let another year pass without achieving Sustainable Jersey certification - four applications have already been submitted! If your municipality is thinking about getting certified or recertified in 2016, there is only **one month left** until applications are due. All applications must be received by **June 5 at 11:59pm**.

Remember, although the majority of your actions should be completed by this date, additional documentation can be added during the application cycle.

## **Funding & Technical Assistance Opportunities**

### **2016 Safe Routes to School Program (SRTS) Grants**

The SRTS grant program is funded through the Federal Highway Administration's Federal Aid Program and is being administered by the NJDOT, in partnership with the North Jersey Transportation Planning Authority (NJTPA), the Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission (DVRPC), and the South Jersey Transportation Planning Organization (SJTPO). Proposed projects must be located within two miles of a school that serves students in grades K-8. Funding for the 2016 SRTS Program will be available for the construction of infrastructure projects only, such as the installation of sidewalks, crosswalks, bike lanes, multi-use paths, traffic calming measures, and other means to ensure the ease and safety of children walking or biking to school. For this solicitation, Urban Aid Communities determined by the Department of Community Affairs, and municipalities containing Schools Development Authority (SDA) Districts outlined by the Educational Facilities Construction and Financing Act, may apply for design as well as construction funds. Any municipality, school district, or county is eligible to apply for funding. Non-profit organizations are not eligible as direct grant recipients for this solicitation. However, non-profit organizations may partner with a local public agency that will assume responsibility and administration for the grant. For more information visit their [website](#).

### **Green Communities Grant Application**


