ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS

President Nicastro: Administrative Reports.

Mayor Greenbaum: I'll start briefly and then I know Sean has a bunch of stuff. Congressman Lance will be at The After on Saturday, March 28th 10:30, join him for a cup of coffee. Also, on Saturday, March 28th, Temple Hatikvah of Flanders is hosting a Grand Wine and Spirits event from 8:00 pm to 10:30 pm. Tickets are \$40.00 per person and cannot be purchased at the door, by State Law you need to buy them in advance. Recreation is running a Lego party, Sunday, March 29th from 11:00 am to 4:00 pm at the Senior Center. Become a master builder in the free play area, face painting, Lego robotics, demonstrations and food to purchase. The event is free. Once again, thank you to all of our sponsors. Finally, the Do or Dye 5K is Saturday, April 25th. I hope everyone will join me as I attempt to finish the course again. Last year we had over 1,000 participants. Sean.

President Nicastro: Thank you. Mr. Canning.

Mr. Canning: Thank you, Mayor. We've been busy with a lot of things, just to keep Council apprised, I try to send emails when I can on different topics as they progress. The 57-acres, we're working closely with the DEP and what they call the Ogden-Rooney process as to deed restrictions. Currently, we're restricted to Class A office space, office research up there. We've been in touch with the DEP, it's about a nine month to a twelve month process, we've started down that road. Splashpad is progressing, working closely with Gene and the engineering on that. We anticipate bids going out in early April. Health benefits, we've been working closely with both MOTPEA, the SOA and the FOP and we've been working with a consultant, as well. We're exploring the possibility of moving from the State Health Benefits to possibly the North Jersey HIF or a comparable plan that provides equal to or better than benefits. So far, it's been very much of a joint cooperative effort with the unions and if there's money to be saved, it would be all around, so it's one of those rising tides, raise all ships. It's been very good so far, so hopefully we'll have something to report to Council within a month, a month in a half if we come to an agreement, if not it'll remain status quo. As a result of the recent transportation shift that we did because of ridership, we recognized in speaking with the Mayor and Frank Wilpert on this that there is an opportunity here for possibly a greater service, not just for our residents, but also more of a regional one as well, that can identify disabled and over 55 year old needy residents for rides. We've modeled it after Five Town Dial-a Ride, which seems to be one of the best models in the County, that's run by Pequannock Township, but its northeast Morris. We're exploring that and working with Fred and Jeff very closely on that, the initial discussions where we're at and I'm working closely with my counterpart in Washington Township is we envision not just Western Morris, but perhaps part of Warren, as well as a regional transportation hub where we can all pool our resources, sort of run it as a joint meeting and that's currently where our thinking is, again, we don't have a business model in place yet, but things generally move pretty fast. If we come up with a viable option, we'll certainly have discussions with area towns and maybe have something for all of the Council's by the end of the year going into 2016. We think there's a nice opportunity here to serve all of our residents and make it cost effective. As you saw in your packet today, there was a Resolution not only to negotiate, but to award...this had to do with the Library. We didn't receive any bids on two bid projects, which I was very surprised at and it had to do with the Library reconstruction. By law, we're allowed to negotiate, we're able to do that rapidly this afternoon with Rapid Recovery. We contacted Fred and Jeff and legally we're very satisfied that we're well within the means of the Local Public Contracts Law and more importantly can commence reconstruction on the Library, hopefully as of tomorrow morning. I'm very grateful,

I want to thank Jeff and Fred in particular on that that we didn't have to wait another 14 days and have the Library be out. The last item, I emailed all the Council and the Department Heads on Dashboard, I don't know if you had a chance to check out the latest on the Townships Departments. We think we've worked through the technical issues on that, we intend on improving it over the next month or two to include a budget component for each of the departments going back about four or five years and what they spent on O&E and S&W, give you a real timeline trend for the departments, but just trying to get more information out to Council. That's my short statement.

Mr. Pasek: I have one matter to report. I just wanted to let Council know that the new purchaser for the Paragon Senior Living Facility has actually closed on the facility. The property is back on the tax rolls. I spoke with Rose Barsanti, the Township's Tax Collector last week and she was in the process of preparing this quarter's tax bill to be sent to the new owner. We filed a stipulation of settlement with the Tax Board and as soon as judgment is entered I'll be very happy to pass on the \$86,000 settlement check for the pilot payment for 2014 to both Sean and Sherry.

I just wanted to also mention that there's a decision you heard last week by the Supreme Court of New Jersey regarding the Council on Affordable Housing and COAH. With that, we've been in contact with Chuck McGroarty because there are various legal options that need to be considered going forward because essentially the Supreme Court is taking the authority away from COAH for right now and has told everybody what you have to do is go to the Superior Court to obtain your Affordable Housing Subsidative Certification or protection from a builders remedy type suit. We're working with Chuck to come up with a strategy and a recommendation as to how to proceed and we'll keep you apprised as this develops.

Mr. Mania: No I haven't had an opportunity to meet with them.

Mr. Mania: Planning Board, I attended the meeting. Unfortunately, I wasn't able to participate because of the variances involved, but just something I would like to share with the Board. If all of you recall, a few months ago I introduced a Resolution to ask gas station owners if they would kindly install generators. It was voted down by the Council. This application the other night at the Planning Board level, I was able to speak not as a Planning Board member, but as a citizen and I got up and I said to the applicant if this application is approved this evening, would you consider putting a generator in. He said, absolutely. I just wanted to share that with the Council. I know you all shot it down, but I just want to let you know that there is a gas station owner who was willing to do it.

President Nicastro: Thank you for the reminder. Mr. Perkins.

Mr. Perkins: I'd like to comment on that, Mr. President, if I might. I remember speaking to Mr. Mania because I was absent at that meeting when you guys all shot that down.

Mr. Mania: You weren't included in this.

Mr. Perkins: I know. I remember going back and I believe it was Mrs. DeCroce who originally had started to try to hook into committee a Bill that would have required gas stations to have either natural gas or propane generators, which I thought was completely absurd, especially in places like Mount Olive where one, we don't have natural gas running through all of the Township and B, there's nothing worse than an unsightly propane tank that's out there. Since it's a gas station and ironically enough one of the first gas stations that was open was the BP on Route 46 who had a gas generator out there was able to pump gas. I was floored and I contacted our 24th Legislative District and of course got no positive response and said geeze, when you get a chance to talk to Betty Lou and of course I sent her an imessage on Facebook and said Betty Lou maybe you should be considering something else. Well, of course that never happened, I'm sure in committee somewhere along the line it died because it's just not cost effective. I'm sure and no disrespect, but I'm sure if you told somebody hey, if your application is approved would you put in a generator...oh sure. I don't think it's a bad idea that we ask and especially when new applicants come in and also it may be something that you ask the locals because it was a fact that they had gas in the tank and the only way they could get it out was to have a generator that was able to turn on some of the pumps and those were the only gas stations along Route 46 and I venture to say on Route 206 that were actually pumping gas. To allow them to have a gas generator, just a strong recommendation. That's enough of my soapbox.
